

THE 'J S LANCASTER MEDAL'

To mark Exceptional Service to the PAGB

The PAGB Meritorious Service Award marks service to the PAGB, the Federations, and their member clubs, but in a small number of cases the service given is so exceptional as to justify a further award.

To give recognition to this exceptional service the PAGB has introduced a Medal, to be known as the 'J S Lancaster Medal' named after the person who proposed the formation of the PAGB and was Secretary from the founding of the PAGB in 1930 to 1946.

No strict criteria is laid down for the award of this Medal, the main requirement being that of 'Exceptional Service to the PAGB'.

The format etc. for the administration of this Medal is as follows:

1. The Sub Committee charged with the administration of this Medal is the President, Vice President, Immediate Past President and those Honory Life Vice Presidents present at the meeting. Three members shall constitute a quorum.
2. Nominations are invited, the closing date for such Nomination to be 31st January in each year, such Nomination, in writing should be forwarded to the PAGB President, the Sub Committee be empowered to nominate.
3. Normally a maximum of five Medals to be awarded in any one year, the recipients name(s) to be announced at the PAGB Annual General Meeting, and hopefully if the person(s) are present the presentation(s) made, if the recipient(s) are not present arrangements for the presentation to be made at an appropriate time, i.e. the PAGB Inter Club Slide Club Championship.
4. In addition to the Medal a Certificate will also be presented.
5. In exceptional circumstances the Medal can be awarded to someone who is not a member of any PAGB affiliated club, but the service they have rendered to the PAGB is exceptional.
6. Holders of the J S Lancaster Medal are entitled to the honorific HonPAGB, which will subsume any previous award of the APAGB.
7. The Medal became available from 1st January 1998.
