

We have lost several stalwarts of Scottish Photography over the past year. We feature another in this issue.

Appreciation Brian Clark ARPS, MPAGB



Brian had an engaging and warm personality and was always a gentleman in his interactions with others. His trademark good humour and dry wit resulted in firm friendships with his fellow photographers in Dundee Photographic Society and the wider Scottish Photographic Community.

Brian's approach to life and indeed photography was to maximise every opportunity. He commented that his attitude was to do as much as possible while still fit and, to that end, in his typically determined fashion, he completed his daily walk along the coastal path at Crail, attended a Pilates class and completed a few rounds of golf every week. His fitness regime, which he continued into his seventh decade, included press ups, which he demonstrated to an audience of fellow DPS photographers who witnessed him drop to the floor and complete 30 press ups in the lounge of the Harris Hotel!

If he had a motto, it would be the aphorism Carpe Diem: seize the day and enjoy life when you can. He put that regularly into practice when in the field, with camera in hand he would set off with a purposeful stride leaving all but the fast walkers in his wake!

Brian was very much his own man with strong views on many subjects and enjoyed the 'to and fro' of debate, but his good humour and the twinkle in his eye ensured that such discussions were good natured without rancour.

Quietly, without fanfare, Brian was very generous in sharing his photographic knowledge and skills with fellow photographers. Whenever approached for advice he gave gladly of his time and, indeed, a common feature of people reflecting on Brian's passing was the number who commented on his generosity of spirit in assisting them. For his part, Brain greatly enjoyed sharing his knowledge and love of photography and took pleasure from people developing skills and enjoying their photographic journey.

Brian created a photography holiday group and kindly invited some of his friends from DPS to join him on visits to some of his favourite places, including Tuscany, Harris, Glen Coe and Northumberland. With good humour and a genuine desire to encourage and help, he would offer his time during these trips to fine tune the settings of individual cameras for the recalcitrant photographers who lacked his discipline to get their settings sorted!

Brian was mystified as to why some of his fellow photographers did not read and understand the camera manual and, consequently, have mastery of the functions of

their camera as he did. This was typical of the man as a businessman, yachtsman, golfer and as a photographer. His approach was to master his subject in order that he could maximise his performance at the given pursuit. He was very much a 'Lad o' pairts'

This approach clearly worked since, through his love of photography, in particular landscape, he enjoyed considerable success at Scottish, UK and international competitions.

Brian was made an Associate of the Royal Photographic Society in 2004 and, in 2014, the Photographic Alliance of Great Britain awarded him a Masters distinction (MPAGB)

International awards included medals from the Federation Internationale de l'Art Photographique, the Photographic Society of America, the Scottish Photographic Federation and the Irish Photographic Federation. Brian also won numerous local and national awards and competitions. His photography has appeared in international exhibitions and in various books and magazines.

For Brian it was also about enjoying the journey as much as arriving at the destination, whether in photography or travel. He saw many wonderful parts of the world, such as Yosemite, the Lofoten Islands and Japan in his photographic journey.

He will be remembered as an unflagging supporter and former President of DPS, but also as a supporter of the wider photographic community.

Brian was brought up in the West of Scotland and it is therefore appropriate to leave the final word to Burns who succinctly sums up the man:

'Few hearts like his, with virtue warm'd, Few heads with knowledge so inform'd: If there's another world, he lives in bliss; If there is none, he made the best of this'


His many friends will remember him as a good man.



FIAP Photo Academy FREE Online Lectures

Since 2020 Paul Stanley from Ireland, has set up and organised various presentations for the FIAP Photo Academy Online Events Service.

You will see these presentations announced live as they become available on our own SPF website homepage. These events are free to attend by SPF members. You simply require to register using the link supplied in the news article to attend.

However, you can also view recordings of many of the previous presentations of the FIAP Photo Academy Online Events which are available on the dedicated FIAP YouTube channel at https://www.voutube.com/@fiapchannel2802/videos

There is a wealth of presentations with great photography and lots of tips and techniques to help us all improve our standards and our appreciation of the work being done by these great masters.

This is a fantastic resource, and the SPF have had it confirmed by Paul Stanley, FIAP Director of FIAP Photo Academy Online Events Service that our SPF Member Clubs are free to use these recordings on their Club night if they wish as long as the presentations are credited to the FIAP Photo Academy Online Events Service, and this service is promoted.

NB – These YouTube videos are not downloadable so you will require internet access to view in your Club. Other content is also available on FIAP's YouTube Channel which may be of interest to individuals.

Does Your Club Need Judges or Speakers?

Does your Club struggle to get Judges or Speakers? Are you looking for new Judges or Lectures in your area? I'm sure the answer is yes! In a few years the issue will be worse unless we get more volunteers now!

Many long-term SPF Judges and Speakers have retired over the past four years, after having served our Scottish Clubs in either capacity for many years (some over 50!). Some may still be Judging or Lecturing in a limited capacity, but they may not do so for long.

Although a few individuals have volunteered to take on the role of Judge or Speaker in recent years, this has not replaced the number of Judges or Speakers we have lost.

In a few years the issue will be much worse, we need Clubs and Individuals to persuade

individuals to volunteer now, to ensure our Clubs all have Judges and Speakers available to visit us at our Clubs.

Worried about what you are committing to? You take on as much or as little as you want to, or what your circumstances will allow. If you only want to do 5 Judgings or talks a year, that is still 5 less that require to be filled by someone else.

Our existing Judges and Lecturers are overrun with invitations from Clubs to fill a slot on their syllabus, they simply can't take on more so why not get in touch with the SPF now and have a chat to find out more about becoming an SPF Judge or Lecturer?

JUDGES & LECTURERS MORE INFO FOR CLUBS i.e. CLUB SECRETARIES, SYLLABUS AND COMPETITION SECRETARIES

The SPF still produces listings of all of their SPF Judges and Lecturers, in its SPF Directory-Handbook, as a PDF supplied by email link. An updated copy of this will be supplied very soon to Club Committee Main Contacts and 2nd Contacts listed with us. These Contacts will also shortly be able to log into our Admin Area at any time to access a copy.

Although the PAGB no longer supplies a printed PAGB Handbook please note the details it contained are still all available to you. The Judges and Lecturers contained in it, from all of the PAGB Federations, including the SPF, have transferred to an online list held on the PAGB CMS website, details of which are given below. This can be accessible by any SPF Member Club Committee Members who register. The SPF have given guidance below of how to gain access.

What does the PAGB CMS contain? – Lists and details of Judges and Lecturers from all of the 15 Federations throughout the UK, called the Speaker's List. Many are willing to do a 'virtual' presentation or Judging. All of our SPF Judges and Lecturers are listed.

It also contains the PAGB Recorded Lecture Service where you can download Lectures, many of which have commentary as MP4 files. It is the same website as you would complete PAGB Competition Entries and view Results or Digital Catalogues of past competitions. You can purchase tickets etc. for upcoming events.

Access the PAGB CMS at - https://pagbhost.co.uk/main/main.php



You must use a personal email address to create your login with (i.e. no secretary@clubemail addresses) as the account is 'personal' to you, not the Club, and you can only have one login account which can be for multiple purposes, and even more than one Club.

To create your login click on the green CES Login/Register button and complete <u>all</u> of the Registration details including entering a password of your choice. A verification email will be sent to you please ensure that you click the link to verify your email address*. You will not be able to proceed until you do. Once your Login has been verified and approved, you can login add extra levels of access as required using the 'Registrations' dropdown. *Please check your spam folder if you don't see the email

NB — You can only have one login account. If you have recently entered a PAGB Award then you will already have a login. You can use the same account for this site. If you are unsure, contact Libby and she will check for you.
