About (the SPF)

We are a non-profitmaking network of almost 90 clubs and societies from Thurso in the north to Dumfries in the south and all areas in between. The sizes and involvement of each club within the SPF varies widely. Founded in 1903, our remit is to promote the art and science of photography through interaction.

To this end, the SPF Executive Committee organises, or participates in, a diary of events annually, mainly in the form of competitions and workshops for both Clubs and Individual Club Members.

We also maintain a mailing list and supply various services, including our e-newsletter to keep you up to date with events, together with that of the PAGB. We maintain and supply our SPF Directory-Handbook which contains details of all SPF Clubs as well as our list of SPF Judges and Lecturers, for booking for in person or virtual presentations and Judgings at your Club. We have extensive guidance notes on a variety of topics to help in running your Club, together with contact details for the SPF Executive Committee who can help.

Through our joint SPF/PAGB membership this gives access to the Club UK network of 15 Federations and Clubs, and with it access to the online listing of Judges and Lecturers from throughout the UK, as virtual or face to face speakers; Access to the PAGB Recorded Lecture service, and also their competitions, events and PAGB Awards scheme. Through this affiliation also comes other exclusive benefits including sponsor's offers and competitive Insurance arrangements for Camera Clubs, to the PAGB network, which you can take advantage of as an affiliated SPF club.

In addition to this UK membership; as a member Club of the SPF, you, and your members, also automatically become members of FIAP which is a worldwide organisation, currently based in Luxembourg. You then have access to their worldwide Distinctions, events, competitions and services.

Who can Join?

For Clubs to be able to join the SPF they must be a camera club, photographic society, photographic club or photographic group with a published constitution and published program of events, united by a common interest in photography, meeting in person for mutual co-operation, education, entertainment, or competition solely from a physical location within Scotland. To help preserve Club memberships we do not accept individual membership, however there are opportunities that individuals within our clubs can benefit from.

Membership

As a condition of joining, as well as paying an annual subscription, you will be asked to supply a copy of your program and sign a declaration to say that you have a published constitution. At all times we require details of at least one club contact to receive all mailings from the SPF. This is usually the club secretary. A second contact is advised, normally the competition secretary. Full details for one club contact must be published in our SPF Directory. We do not give personal details to anyone out with the SPF.

Annual Subscriptions

The cost! – There is a combined membership fee for SPF & PAGB membership. As we are also members of FIAP, this also includes affiliation to them. Our club subscription is a 'per member' rate meaning smaller clubs pay less than bigger clubs. This is set annually at our AGM and payable by the clubs, to the SPF Treasurer, by 31st Dec. Renewal details are emailed out to member clubs every November. The SPF require you to lodge a copy of your syllabus with us when submitting your Membership Declaration Form, but this is no longer an Insurance requirement.

Annual documentation for Membership for the coming year, will be available from the services webpage in two different formats, as soon as details are known. However, all member Clubs are automatically sent all renewal details by November annually. This is sent to all Club Main Contacts and 2nd Contacts listed with us. NB – For the majority of Clubs we don't hold Treasurer's details on our e-mailing list.

Membership & Subscriptions Changes due to Covid.

This area will explain any temporary arrangements in place due to the aftermath of Covid.

Insurances

Through membership of the SPF, you have access to competitive insurance arrangements for camera clubs and photographers, as part of the PAGB network of Clubs via the Insurance Broker HIVE. The Insurance Brokers HIVE have agreed preferential rates of Insurance exclusively for PAGB/SPF Clubs. Application and Payment are direct to Insurance Brokers HIVE. *Please see full details on our SPF website including a link to the Insurance Broker's online application form.*

- **Management Liability Insurance** (Also known as Trustee's Liability Insurance) cover for all Club committee members, to protect their personal assets. This is also available from Insurance Brokers, as arranged by the PAGB, at a preferential rate. The policy continues to run from 1st Feb to 31st Jan. Application and Payment are direct to HIVE.
- **Public Liability Insurance** is available from Insurance Brokers, as arranged by the PAGB, at a preferential rate. The policy continues to run from 1st Feb to 31st Jan. PLI is optional but highly recommended. The policy continues to run from 1st Feb to 31st Jan. Application and Payment are direct to HIVE.
- **All Risks Insurance** to cover equipment owned or loaned to the club. Cover is available from the Insurance Brokers HIVE. The policy continues to run from 1st Feb to 31st Jan.

e-Mailing Lists & e-Newsletters

Our member clubs receive regular emails containing information and details of events relevant to a camera club or society. This includes subscription renewals, rule changes, event notifications and results. In addition, clubs receive both the **SPF e-FLASH**, our own e-newsletter and the PAGB's newsletter **PAGB e-news** via email. From time to time, they also include offers from photographic supply companies, exclusive to our member clubs. These e-communications combine to keep you updated with any information we think may be useful to your club members, as well as essential information.

SPF Directory & PAGB Handbook Replacement

This is not available on our website as we comply with strict Data Protection protocols, so is only supplied to Club Committees for their Club's use.

All member Clubs are provided with a copy of the SPF Directory-Handbook several times per year. The SPF Directory-Handbook lists all of our SPF Member Clubs, SPF Judges and Lecturers, along with our SPF Executive. This is supplied as a link to an electronic PDF format booklet for either online use or as a printed booklet.

All of the SPF Clubs' details are supplied to aid Clubs in organising or advertising events, between one another. We are also happy to promote events between Clubs from time to time via email, this website or our e-FLASH. We retain this information securely and confidentially and we never divulge these details to anyone else. Re data handling, we are registered with the Information Commission and comply with all Data Protection requirements. The Data Protection Officer is Libby Smith.

Almost all of the SPF Judges and Lecturers contained within our SPF Directory-Handbook are willing to visit clubs for out-of-pocket expenses only, also included is information useful to running a club, correct procedures for booking Judges & lecturers, help and advice on organising digital competitions together with entering SPF competitions and details of what is allowed, as well as current definitions.

The PAGB used to supply a PAGB Handbook which contained Judges and Lecturers from all 15 Federations, together with additional information. The PAGB Handbook is no longer published and has been replaced by a PAGB Online Judges and Speaker's list as part of its CMS (formerly CES website)*. SPF Club Committee members can register for access to this area to see and book Judges and Lecturers from any Federation. You can now also search the lists to see who will be happy to present 'virtually'.

*PAGB CES Online Services inc replacement for PAGB Handbook

The CMS holds information such as contact details and Club and Federation memberships. Since anyone in the world can create an account, account holders must be specifically authorised to access only the information they require for whatever status they have as a Club member, a Club officer or a Federation officer. We call these 'approvals', which must be requested, independently verified, and then managed over time.

The PAGB has produced a printed Handbook, once every two years, which has been delivered as one copy per Club. The Handbook contained a mix of content, such as contact details and procedures, but the majority of the content was the lists of approved judges and lecturers from throughout the PAGB. This made the Handbook vital to programme secretaries. This information is now held within the PAGB CES and is administered by the various Federations. So far the CES has over 600 judges and about 1000 lectures. More will follow.

With this on-line speaker's register it is now possible for an approved CES account holder to access details of speakers without searching for the handbook, or wondering whether the information is still accurate.

So, what does 'approved' mean in this context? Just as the Handbook was available for use by any member of a Club committee or a Federation committee, the accounts in CES which can access the speakers' contact information are those approved as a Club or Federation officer (committee member).

Now that the CES has evolved into a service delivery system, there is a real need for Club committee members to have a CES account with Club officer approval so that they can access services for their Club. There are still many PAGB affiliated Clubs which have no officers recorded in the CES. Those Clubs

have effectively excluded themselves excluded from PAGB provided services until they have at least one account approved as an officer.

The Judges and Lecturers listed in both the SPF Directory-Handbook and the PAGB CMS website, unless otherwise indicated, charge no fee and agree to the standard arrangement for bookings and out of pocket expenses, as outlined on our SPF 'All Things Judging and Lecturing' page of our website or on the PAGB website. The maximum expenses rate for car travel is set by the PAGB and SPF.

Events

Everything under the EVENTS dropdown is about SPF run Events. Historically the SPF has organised competitions, these have grown over the years. Two of these events are audience based where club members can attend whether or not their Club has entered; another competition results in a CD being available for showing on a Club night, and one is a worldwide competition with an exhibition, and CD 'to hire' after the event for a Club night.

SPF Digital Championship is a club competition open to projected digital images (PDI), held in November each year. It is judged in front of an audience by three judges. Entries are submitted in advance.

SPF Print Championship is a club and individual competition open to Monochrome and Colour prints, held in Feb each year. It is judged in front of an audience by three judges. Entries are submitted in advance.

SPF Annual Portfolios is a club and individual competition open to Mono and Colour Prints, and Digital (PDI) entries. Entries submitted by 1st May. Judged in camera, by three judges; Portfolio shows of the accepted entries are sent to Clubs on disc in the Nov following the event.

SPF Scottish International Salon was run annually but is currently in abeyance. It is open to all photographers whether SPF members or not. Entries are submitted in advance from throughout the world in Mar/Apr. It is judged in camera by nine judges. All entrants receive a colour catalogue. An exhibition is held in May/June. When running, a show is available to hire on DVD from the Custodian.

SPF Audio Visual Day was run annually by the SPF but has not run for a couple of years due to dwindling numbers attending. It has varied due to the transition period between traditional and digital. We hope to resurrect this event in a slightly different format. It was previously an audience event for audio visual enthusiasts, with visiting speakers and member's sequences.

We used to run Judging Workshops for prospective SPF Judges, but our system has now changed and we now run a process to encourage individuals interested in Judging to gain practical 'on the job' experience first as C List Judges. Once they have had a level of experience, we invite them along to a Judges Assessment Day to ascertain if they are ready to be added to our accredited list of B List Judges. This was done in an aim to encourage more individuals to give Judging a go.
